WHAT GOD EXPECTS

We need to learn what God expects us to do, as His people.

Let's begin this study by memorizing Matthew 22:37:

JESUS SAID TO HIM, "YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND."

As Christians, we should always remember what God expects from us. He wants us to fear Him, follow Him, and serve Him wholeheartedly.

"And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all His ways and to love Him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul." — Deuteronomy 10:12

In this lesson, you will learn:

- We should fear God
- We should love Him and obey Him.
- We should serve Him from our hearts.

All your good deeds, your works, should come from your heart. They should not be just an outward show for others to see. When the Lord looks at your works and judges them, He does not see the outward appearance of the work, but your inward motive. The outward actions of going to church, witnessing, doing good works, etc., do not make you a Christian. Going to church does not make you a Christian any more than eating fast food makes you a hamburger! You are a Christian because Jesus has come inside your heart. Then your outward actions show others what has happened inside your heart.
